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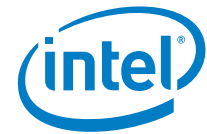
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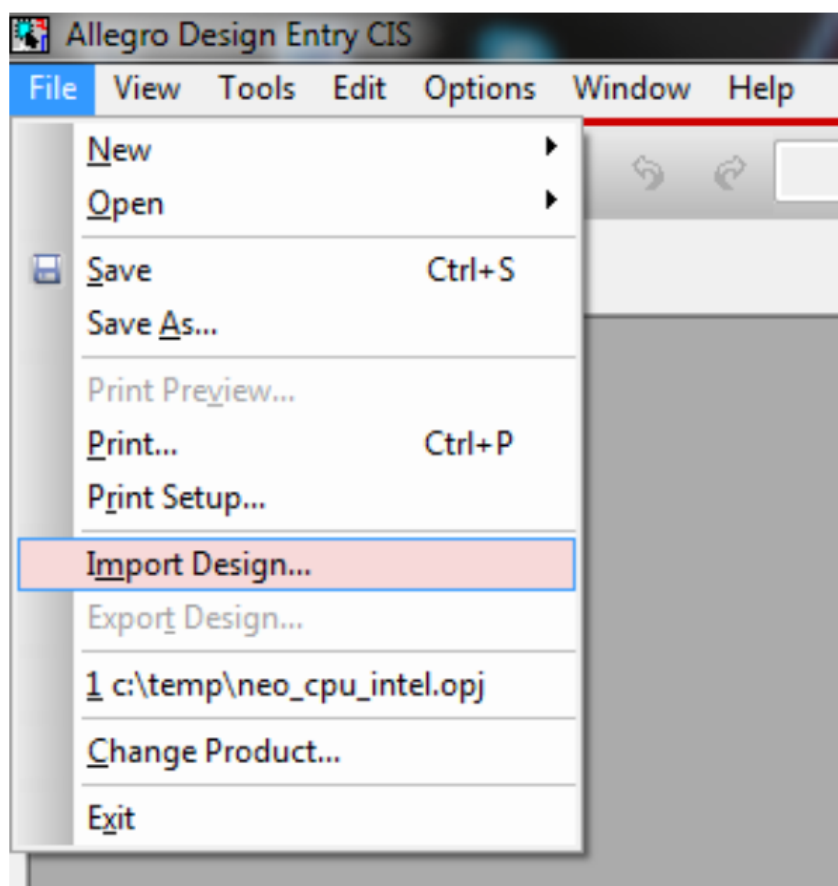

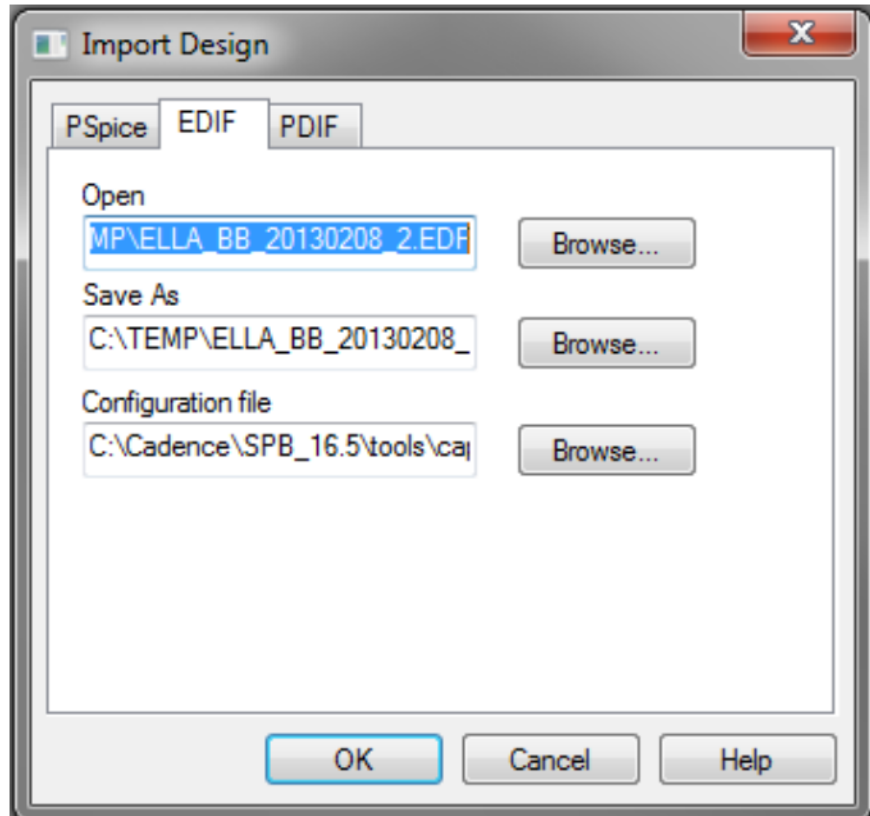

1 *Guide to Export EDIF Files to PDF*

1. Open Capture
2. Select File → Import Design



3. Select EDIF Tab and input the Capture EDIF file. On the Configuration file, go to C:\Cadence\SPB_16.5\tools\capture\ and select EDI2CAP.CFG.



4. It will convert it to a Capture file (DSN) and you can print PDF from there.
